Public Comment: No public comments were made.

Public Health and Human Services Director Pugleasa and Public Health Supervisor Myhre provided an update on the COVID-19 pandemic and response from Public Health and Human Services. Pugleasa told the board that they were seeing a rise in COVID-19 cases driven by the Delta variant. The Delta variant was widespread throughout the County, State, region, and Houston County. The Delta variant was more contagious than previous variants. Pugleasa said that information regarding the current state of COVID-19 was changing rapidly. He said that the vaccine was highly effective in preventing breakthrough infections and serious illness. Myhre told the board that Houston County Public Health did not have any vaccine on hand currently, but that local partners like pharmacies and healthcare providers still had the vaccine readily available. Pugleasa told the board that some companies were requiring employees to wear masks once again. He said they would continue to provide updates to the board as needed.

The next meeting would be regular board meeting on August 10, 2021. The number of households served and money spent in each county varies yearly. There are stringent client eligibility requirements that must be met before we can assist any household. Semcac also administers a Rapid Re-Housing Program (RRH) and a scattered site Transitional Housing Program (THP) over the seven county area. Mower County receives a United Way fund to serve households in jeopardy of losing their housing. Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Houston, and Winona counties have emergency assistance funds that can also be accessed for a housing payment.

Semcac administered CHAPS funding, equaling over 1.4 million, in our service area from August through December 2020. CHAPS funding assisted households affected by the pandemic with housing and utility assistance. The housing or emergency assistance program serving a household, is dependent upon which funding source the household qualifies for and funds available. - The Family Homeless Prevention and Assistance Program (FHPAP) is funded by the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency (MHFA) through Minnesota Statute 462A.204. This program requires a local County Board Resolution of Support (No county financial support is requested or implied at this time).
- 2. The program is awarded \$1,251,800 for a grant term of October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2023.
- 3. Three Rivers is the fiscal agent and administrator of this program as well as a service provider for 4 counties. Three Rivers sub-contracts this program to Semcac for 7 counties and Lutheran Social Services of MN for youth services in Rochester. Together, all partners have served approximately 417 households for the current biennium in 11 counties for the prevention and elimination of homelessness.
- 4. The FHPAP program serves families, youth and singles. Household must be at imminent risk of homelessness and in need of services and/or financial assistance due to a housing crisis. Households must demonstrate financial need where no other resources are available through either public or private sources; or those resources are insufficient to resolve the present crisis and avoid literal homelessness. This program serves households at or below 200% FPG. Each participant receiving FHPAP assistance signs a program agreement and is encouraged to work with our housing advocacy specialists for on-going case management.
- The FHPAP program is designed to prevent homelessness or help households re-locate without a day of homelessness. An additional goal of the program is to reduce days of homelessness.






