Call to order.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Prior to approving the agenda the first action item was removed. A tobacco license was requested, but the request needed to go through the City rather than the County. Motion was made by Commissioner Burns, seconded by Commissioner Johnson motion unanimously carried to approve the agenda with the changes.

Motion was made by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Burns, motion unanimously carried to approve the meeting minutes from July 26, 2022.

Public Comment: No public comments were made.

#### APPOINTMENTS

Houston County Historical Society President Shirley Johnson and Houston County Historical Society Vice President Deborah Wray gave a Houston County Historical Society presentation to the board. They thanked the County for its continued support of the Historical Society. Johnson said things were improving at the Historical Society with visitors returning after the pandemic. They shared they had been having lots of visitors including teachers and summer school students. They had been working on new displays for the Houston County Fair, and were always looking for more volunteers. Projects for upcoming years included finishing

the entrance of the new museum, adding a parking lot on the south side of the new building, and adding a sidewalk. Commissioners thanked the Historical Society and volunteers for their service. Commissioner Johnson suggested that perhaps the County's Historic Jail could be used by the Historical Society in the future.

At 9:18 a.m. a motion was made by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Severson, motion carried unanimously to go into closed session pursuant to Minn. Stat. 13D.05, subdivision 1 (d), attorney – client privilege to consider the recent MAPE arbitration results. All Commissioners, Attorney Jandt, and Human Resources Director Kruger attended the closed session.

At 9:49 a.m. a motion was made by Commissioner Burns, seconded by Commissioner Severson, motion carried unanimously to reopen the regular meeting. The Commissioners had discussed with Attorney Jandt the recent MAPE arbitration results.

#### DISCUSSION ITEMS

Commissioners discussed recent meetings they had attended and upcoming meetings.

Chairperson Myhre said the Auditor's Office would be open for public accuracy testing on Wednesday, August 3. He said the Auditor's Office would be open on Saturday, August 6<sup>th</sup> for absentee voting from 10-3 p.m. Chairperson Myhre said the primary election would be held on August 9<sup>th</sup>. He said a copy of the primary ballot was printed in the official newspaper, on the website, and posted near the Auditor's office. Two Commissioners would be needed for the canvasing meeting on Friday, August 12<sup>th</sup> at 10 a.m.

Commissioner Johnson said he wanted to discuss the Facilities Utilization Study that had been voted on at the prior meeting. Johnson said he felt he had been deceived on the matter. He said he had never been made aware that the study would include the Historic Jail, and that when the Commissioners gave a general consensus to move forward with finding a firm interested in the work he did not think the work would include the Historic Jail. Commissioner Severson said an email had been sent in May that included a reference to the Historic Jail. He pulled the email up on his computer. Commissioner Johnson asked if his name was on the email. Commissioner Severson said it was not. Commissioner Johnson asked Human Resources Director Kruger why he had not been included on the email. Kruger said she did not have a good reason and had made an error. Commissioner Burns said Commissioner Johnson should be included on emails in the future. Commissioner Myhre then asked why the new County Justice Center had not been included in the areas to study as it was a current area being utilized. The proposal that included the Historic Jail had already been approved the week prior, but Kruger said she could ask if the new County Justice Center could also be added to the study. It was the general consensus of the Commissioners that Kruger should ask if the County Justice Center could be added to the study.

Closing Public Comment: None.

Commissioner Johnson moved, Commissioner Severson seconded, motion unanimously carried to adjourn the meeting at 11:27 a.m. The next meeting would be regular meeting on August 9, 2022.

#### CRITERIA FOR GRANTING CONDITIONAL USE PERMITS

NAME OF APPLICANT: Edward and Janice Hammell DATE: July 28, 2022 I.U.P. REQUESTED: To have an agriculture oriented business in the agriculture protection district.

The Planning Commission shall not recommend an interim use permit unless they find the following:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

Section 11.05 of the Houston County Zoning Ordinance requires the following:

1. That the proposed use conforms to the County Land Use Plan.

Staff Analysis: The Comprehensive Land Use Plan identifies prioritizing agriculture and its supporting industries. In addition, this use is being proposed on an existing homestead on ground that is outside of environmentally sensitive areas and off prime agricultural ground.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

2. That the applicant demonstrates a need for the proposed use.

Staff Analysis: The applicant identifies there is a continuous need for repair of equipment in farming operations.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.

Staff Analysis: This proposal will not include the addition of any new structures; it simply consists of allowing a business at an existing site. There will be no wastewater or pollutants generated.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

4. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.

Staff Analysis: This proposal will not include any new activity or structures as the shed has already been permitted.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.

Staff Analysis: N/A

6. That potential pollution hazards been addressed and that standards have been met.

Staff Analysis: There will be no wastewater generated from the shop building and welding generally does not generate a pollution hazard.

Rich Schild asked Ed if he paints a lot of stuff. Ed stated that he does some painting but he will not have a paint booth and that he does do a lot of brush painting.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.

Staff Analysis: All necessary utilities are currently present at the site and drainage from the building was addressed during the variance process. Any new utility requirement will be the responsibility of the applicant.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

8. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.

Staff Analysis: The applicant feels that the parking area in front of the shop will be adequate to meet the needs of the business.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

9. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.

Staff Analysis: N/A

10. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.

Staff Analysis: Surrounding properties are primarily residential or agricultural in nature. This use will largely mimic activities that place on an active farming operation.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

11. That the establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.

Staff Analysis: Surrounding property available for development is primarily agricultural and this business proposal will not impede orderly development for agricultural or residential uses.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

12. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.

Staff Analysis: Besides family, the two closest dwellings are over a quarter mile away. While welding generates noise and fumes, it will be limited to the immediate vicinity of the building. No lighted signs are proposed.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

Staff Analysis: N/A

<u>Staff Analysis:</u> When the requirements are met, a conditional use permit provides a mechanism for establishing an agricultural orientated business in a highway business district that conforms to Houston County's Land Use Plan.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

2. That the applicant demonstrates a need for the proposed use.

<u>Staff Analysis:</u> The applicant proposes to repair agricultural equipment, including repair of machinery, semi-trucks and trailers used for agricultural purposes, which is a legitimate need.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.

<u>Staff Analysis:</u> With adequate surface water control and a properly constructed and operated SSTS for managing septage the water quality will not be compromised.

<u>Staff Analysis:</u> The proposed high percentage of impermeable surfaces and structures will require adequate surface water management, including construction, operation, possible treatment, energy dissipation and infiltration to reduce surface water runoff.

Staff Analysis: There is adequate space for off street parking and vehicle loading.

Staff Analysis: Substantially larger site distances, transition zones, upgraded subbase and other features are needed for truck traffic. Traffic from the proposed facility will have to egress from Angus drive. A 3/04/2022 E-mail from MNDOT to Amelia Meiners noted that access from HWY 44 will likely not be granted. Based on the proposed number of vehicles transitioning from the facility the site has enough area to prevent traffic hazards.

Board agreed to the finding by a unanimous vote.

<u>Staff Analysis:</u> While the proposed hours of operation and activities are typical of a commercial site. Staff Analysis: The proposed use for the parcel meets the intent of Houston County's Land Use Plan.

#### HOUSTON COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION

#### **RELATIVE TO APPLICATION BY**

#### Joseph Rud and Craig Helke 7/28/22

The County Board may adopt amendments to the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map in relation both to land uses within a particular district or to the location of the district lines. Such amendments shall not be issued indiscriminately, but shall only be used as a means to reflect changes in the goals and policies of the community as reflected in the Policies Plan or changes in conditions in the County.

Subdivision 2. Applications to Change District Boundaries or Land Use.

- 1. A 1969 rezone changed a 120-foot by 220-foot area from A-1 Agricultural Protection to B-1 Highway Service Business. This is essentially an expansion of an existing Highway Business District.
- 2. The property at 11489 State 44 is zoned Highway Business District. This is just over a half mile further from the City of Caledonia than the parcel considering rezoning.
- 3. CLUP (Comprehensive Land Use Policy) 0100.0506 subd. 2 policy 1 provided that development should be located near cities where services can be provided. The location is approximately one mile from the City of Caledonia.

#### **OVERVIEW**

#### REQUEST

The petitioners are requesting a Conditional Use Permit to place a cabin in the agricultural protection district of Black Hammer Township.

#### **SUMMARY OF NOTEWORTHY TOPICS**

The Houston County Zoning Ordinance provides the following requirements for cabin structures:

#### 14.3 CONDITIONAL USES

**Subdivision 1. Conditional Uses.** In the Agricultural Protection District, the following uses may be allowed only after obtaining a Conditional Use Permit in accordance with the provision of this Ordinance.

- (5) Cabins. Cabins, subject to the following:
  - (a) Not more than one (1) cabin per quarter of a quarter section shall be allowed.
  - (b) A cabin shall not have a permanent foundation or basement, or otherwise be permanently attached to the ground.
  - (c) A cabin shall be for transient use only and shall not be used as a permanent, year-around dwelling.
  - (d) No cabin shall have a gross floor area exceeding 400 square feet.
  - (e) Cabins shall not be connected to modern utilities, including electricity, telephone service, and septic.

#### TOWNSHIP AND NEIGHBORHOOD COMMENTS

Notice was sent to Black Hammer Township and the ten closest property owners. Two comments were received and are included in the packet.

#### SITE CHARACTERISTICS

This is a 53.08-acre parcel in Black Hammer Township. A majority of the parcel is tillable acreage, but the south boundary includes a strip of timber. There are no cabins located on adjacent property within this quarter-quarter. The applicant has cleared some of the timber at this location and the slopes are under 12% grade. Soils in the proximity are primarily 103C2, a Seaton silt loam, and on the boundary of 580D2, another silt loam. Both recommend designing structures to fit the natural slope of the land. The property is accessed from Kyseth Road, which adjoins the property in the northeast corner. An access road will be constructed down the western boundary of the property through what is currently field. The driveway will meet all standards.

There are two dwellings about 2,500 feet from the proposed location. One is to the north and the other the west.

Riceford Creek is approximately 375 feet east of the proposed location. That puts this site outside of the shoreland district. In addition, it is outside of floodplain and there are no wetland concerns. The cabin will meet property line and top of bluff setback requirements. There is an intermittent stream approximately 500 feet to the south.

It should be noted that Beacon property lines are not correct for this parcel. There is a survey corner off in this area that shifts the parcel west about ten feet on the south end to almost 30 feet on the north. In addition, the north property line should start at the center of the township road.

Upon receiving public comments, staff looked into the property boundary in question with assistance from the Surveyor's Office. The deeds for both properties are consistent and reference a "southwesterly" line. Beacon has this mapped relatively correctly (see paragraph above). There is no evidence to support the property line indicated on the FSA map and the USDA includes a disclaimer stating that deeds were not referenced in creation of maps. The legal description on the neighbor's RIM easement is consistent with the deeds as well. The cabin location is currently 70 feet from the "southwesterly" property line.

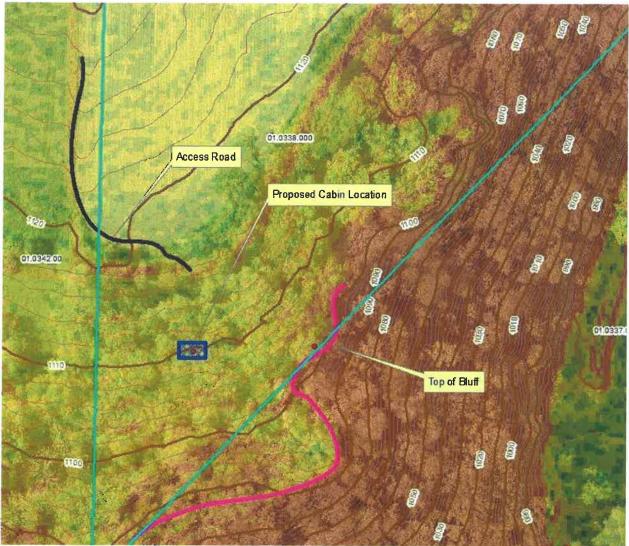


Figure 2. Site layout. The access road is shown in black, the cabin is shown in blue and the top of bluff is drawn in pink. Red is slopes over 24% grade.

#### **OVERVIEW**

#### REQUEST

The applicants are requesting a conditional use permit to construct a steel framed building with concrete surfaces on the north and east sides of the building. The facility will be used to repair agricultural equipment, including repair of machinery, semi-trucks and trailers used for agricultural purposes. Work will be performed within the building. The primary goal is to serve the agricultural community.

The conditional use permit is requested under Houston County Zoning Ordinance (HCZO) 16.3 Subdivision 1. (1) Conditional Uses (1) Agriculture Oriented Business. In the Highway Protection District, the Agriculture Oriented Business may be allowed only after obtaining a Conditional Use Permit in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 Conditional Use Permits.

#### SUMMARY OF NOTEWORTHY TOPICS

The project will raze all of the existing structures and change the egress from State Road 44 to Angus Drive.

An application for rezoning the parcel to Highway Business district from Agriculture Protection District was submitted on June 18, 2022. Additionally, the applicant has an outstanding application for a conditional use permit in the Agriculture Protection District. Consequently, this conditional use permit is predicated on the corresponding rezoning being approved.

#### Of note:

HCZO Section 29.9 Subdivision 2. All Zoning Districts in the County may require a conditional use permit for any exterior storage if it is demonstrated that such storage is a hazard to the public health and safety or has a depreciating effect upon nearby property values, or impairs scenic views, or constitutes a nuisance.

HCZO Section 29.12 Subdivision 6 (1). No person may store or keep any vehicle of a type requiring a license to operate on the public highway; but without a current license, attached hereto, whether the vehicle be dismantled or not, outside of an enclosed building in the residential or agricultural district.

HCZO Section 29.13 Subdivision 1. Where any business or industrial use (structure, parking or storage) is adjacent to property zoned for residential use, that business or industry shall provide screening along the boundary of the residential property. Screening shall also be provided where a business, parking lot or industry is across the street from a residential zone but not on the side of a business or industry considered to be the front.

HCZO Section 30.4 Subdivision 7. In General Business and Highway Business Districts and in Limited and General Business Districts, parking areas and access drives shall be covered with a dust-free all-weather surface with proper surface drainage, as required by the County Engineer. The operator of the principal building or use shall maintain parking and loading areas, access drives and yard areas well-kept.

HCZO Section 30.4 Subdivision 8. Lighting shall be reflected away from the public right of way and nearby or adjacent Residence Districts.

Sign regulations are covered under Ch173, MN Statutes.

#### **TOWNSHIP AND NEIGHBORHOOD COMMENTS**

Public Notice of the June 28, 2022 Conditional Use Permit application was published in the July 13, 2022 edition of the Caledonia Argus. Multiple comments were received and are included in the packet.

In the previous application for a conditional use permit in the Agricultural Protection District the the following comments were received in writing and in person:

- 1. Potential for decreased property values,
- 2. Screening for site activities,
- 3. Storage of parts and/or junk outside,
- 4. Signage,
- 5. Lighting,
- 6. Well & Septic upgrades,
- 7. Roadway surfacing and long-term responsibility,

- 9. Surface water management and protection of the Crooked Creek Watershed,
- 10. Seeding open areas and control noxious weeds,
- 11. Business relocation or new venture,
- 12. Ultimately commercial zoning and status of both parcels,
- 13. Highway 44 egress,
- 14. Meeting the definition of agriculture orientated business,
- 15. Potential to become a trucking terminal,
- 16. Traffic management,
- 17. Evesore and community presence.
- 18. Project support from an adjacent land owner based on the need for farm related repair facilities.

Additional comments were recorded during the February 24, 2022 hearing on the conditional use permit application for an agricultural orientated business in an agricultural protection district.

#### SITE CHARACTERISTICS

The site relief will not inhibit the proposed CUP activities. The site soils in the proposed development are characterized as Seaton Silt loam with a capability rating of III e. The existing infrastructure located on the site will be razed. The development will disturb greater than 1 acre of land with an estimated .4 acre of tillable acreage being used. A small portion of the parcel is designated commercial from a 9/11/1969 zoning action.

#### **EVALUATION**

\*The Planning Commission may determine that more information is necessary to address all concerns adequately.

Section 11.05 of the Houston County Zoning Ordinance requires the following:

Subdivision 1. Findings. The Planning Commission shall not recommend a conditional use permit unless they find the following:

1. That the proposed use conforms to the County Land Use Plan.

#### Staff Analysis:

When the requirements are met, a conditional use permit provides a mechanism for establishing an agricultural orientated business in a highway business district that conforms to Houston County's Land Use Plan.

2. That the applicant demonstrates a need for the proposed use.

#### Staff Analysis:

The applicant proposes to repair agricultural equipment, including repair of machinery, semi-trucks and trailers used for agricultural purposes, which is a legitimate need.

3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.

#### Staff Analysis:

With adequate surface water control and a properly constructed and operated SSTS for managing septage the water quality will not be compromised.

4. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.

#### Staff Analysis:

The proposed high percentage of impermeable surfaces and structures will require adequate surface water management, including construction, operation, possible treatment, energy dissipation and infiltration to reduce surface water runoff.

5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.

#### **Staff Analysis:**

The soil bearing capacity is adequate for the proposed structure. The soils can be compacted and graded for the proposed roadways. Additional surface water management features can be incorporated to enhance the site's infiltration capability.

6. That potential pollution hazards been addressed and that standards have been met.

#### Staff Analysis:

While an erosion control plan in HCZO Section 24 is required, the primary pollution from sediment loading will be addressed in the MPCA permitting requirements because greater than 1 acre is being disturbed. The facility is proposing that all activities will be performed indoors including management of solvents, degreasers, fuels and lubricants. Additionally, new construction materials and methods have substantially improved energy efficiencies and waste minimizations.

7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.

#### **Staff Analysis:**

The proximity to existing structures and the City of Caledonia likely lends itself to accessing gas, electrical and other utilities. Adequate frontage exists with gentle slopes allowing access to Angus drive.

8. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.

#### Staff Analysis:

There is adequate space for off street parking and vehicle loading

9. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.

#### Staff Analysis:

Substantially larger site distances, transition zones, upgraded subbase and other features are needed for truck traffic. Traffic from the proposed facility will have to egress from Angus drive. A 3/04/2022 E-mail from MNDOT to Amelia Meiners noted that access from HWY 44 will likely not be granted. Based on the proposed number of vehicles transitioning from the facility the site has enough area to prevent traffic hazards.

10. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.

#### **Staff Analysis:**

While the proposed hours of operation and activities are typical of a commercial site. The surrounding area is an agricultural protection district and commercial activities are similar in nature. Screening, vegetation, exterior lighting and other activities can be implemented to substantially reduce the view shed of the building to the local residences.

11. That the establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.

#### Staff Analysis:

The proposed use for the parcel meets the intent of Houston County's Land Use Plan.

12. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.

#### Staff Analysis:

The applicant proposes to perform all work indoors and the roadways will be maintained to prevent fugitive dust. The lighting will be directed down and the signage will be minimal. As noted in the Staff Analysis for Finding No.10 screening and vegetation blocking the viewshed toward the residences will substantially reduce the disturbance to neighbors.

13. That the density of any proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or not greater than the density indicated by the applicable Zoning District.

#### Staff Analysis:

Thanks for taking the time to meet with me on your site in section 12 of Caledonia Township. From a water erosion/discharge standpoint here are my comments. I understand that you are proposing to build a mechanic shop on the site and all existing building structures are to be removed. The existing roof area amounts to approximately 6,575 sq. ft. and these buildings will be eliminated. The roof on the proposed building and other impervious area is estimated to be around 2.5 acres. Access will be off Angus Dr. to the north and will consist of gravel and possibly seal coat or black top. Additional impervious area may include an area around the entire building of gravel or other impervious material. This additional impervious area was included in runoff curve number calculations. All areas directly adjacent to the building site will be sown to grass/legume mixed hay, Kentucky Bluegrass/fescue on the lawn, or other sod-forming vegetation. This type of vegetation will ensure adequate soil armor while allowing for adequate water infiltration. When estimating runoff and peak discharge from the site I find that the existing grassed waterway that drains runoff from the building site to the south is adequate for the proposed use during a 10 year storm event.

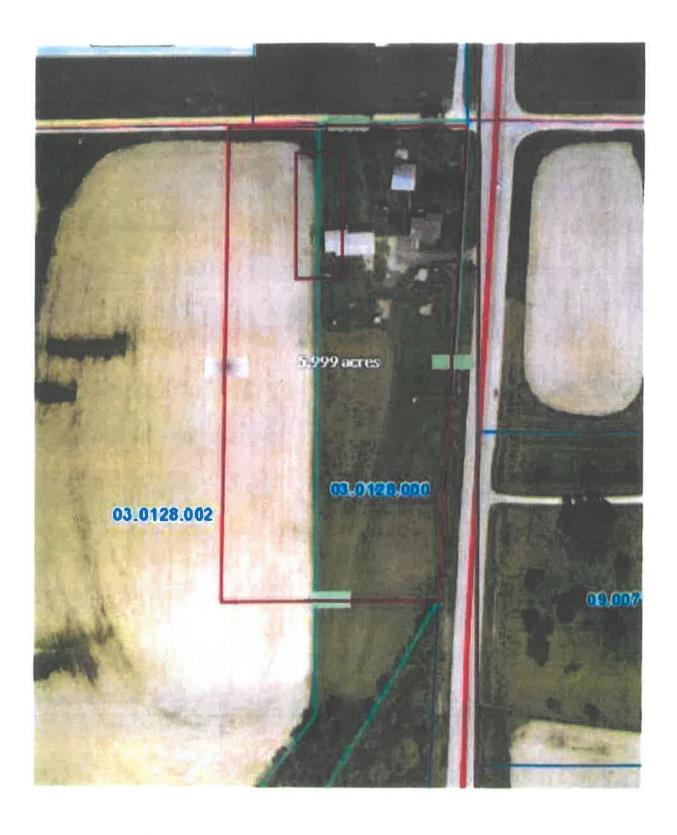
The site consists of approximately 18 acres of B and C slopes. The proposed building will sit on a 103B2 – Seaton Silt Loam soil of 3-6% slope. According to the *USDA Soil Survey*, these soils are typically comprised of a topsoil approximately 9" thick with a 60" subsoil of dark yellowish brown to brown silt loam. Air and water move through these soils at a moderate rate and the water-holding capacity is very high. These soils are found all around the county and are suitable for building site development.

Areas directly adjacent to the proposed building site location are made up of 103C2 – Seaton Silt Loam soils of 6-12% slope. According to the *USDA Soil Survey*, these soils are typically comprised of a topsoil approximately 8" thick with a 60" subsoil of yellowish brown silt loam. Again, air and water move through this soil at a moderate rate with a high water-holding capacity. These soils are well suited for forage crops and pasture so sod should be easily established for erosion control and water infiltration from the adjacent impervious areas.

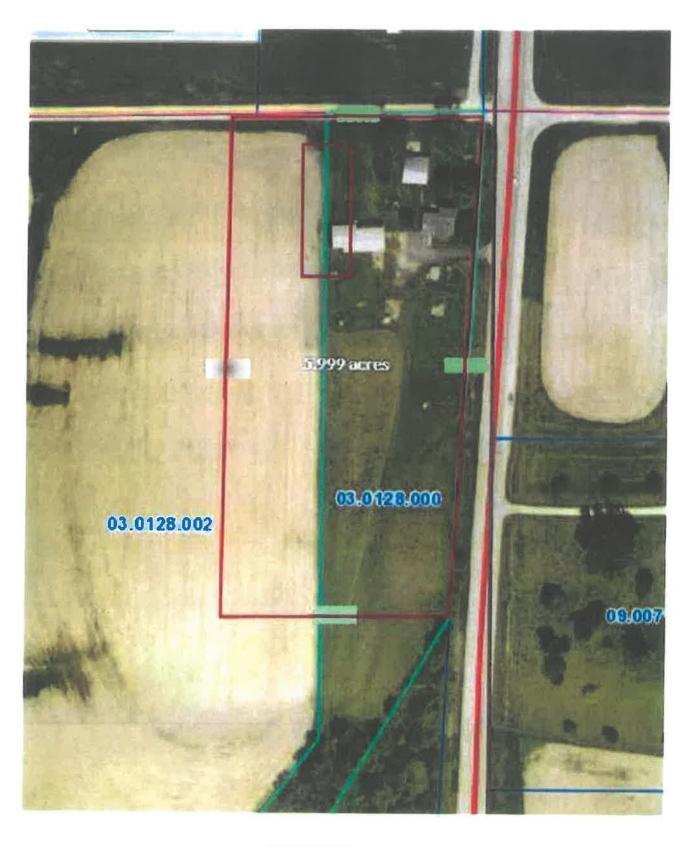
The existing waterway directly south of the building site is made up of an 1857B – Eitzen silt loam of 1-6% slopes. The surface area of these soils is made up of dark greyish brown silt loam of about 9" thick. The subsoil can range from dark greyish brown, friable silt loam to black, friable silt loam to a depth of about 72". These soils move air and water through the profile at a moderate rate, the water-holding capacity is very high, and surface runoff is medium.

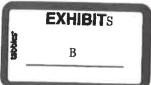

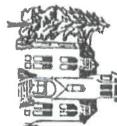

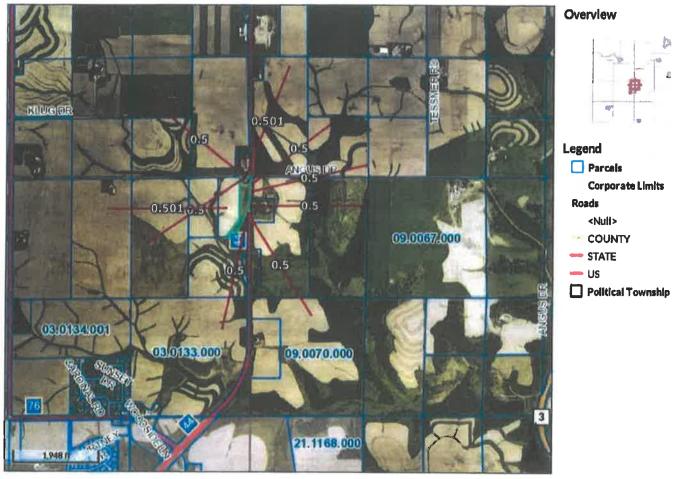

We are writing in response to your inquiry set forth in your email of February 10, 2022. We will address your inquiries in the order they appear.

- 1. Business objectives. The business would primarily serve the local farming community with the repair of farm equipment. They have expertise in the repair and maintenance of tractors used to haul trailers for agricultural supplies.
- 2. Hours of operation. Monday through Friday 7 AM to 4PM.
- 3. Anticipated traffic and number of trips per day into/out of the facility. How many employees? There will be six employees. Other than the employees, there will be primarily local customers. Any sales are done primarily by internet.
- 4. Detailed list of Products & Services When I was reviewing my notes sales was mentioned, but that was not addressed in the application. We will primarily be maintaining and repairing farm equipment. There would be some sales. The sales consist 90% from equipment that has been repaired.
- 5. Parking locations for employees, service vehicles, customers. Employee will park on the west side of the building. The customers would park on the west side or east side.

- a. How many pieces of equipment may be sitting outside for sale at a time? We do not anticipate many pieces of equipment sitting outside of the building. The building will be 43,750 square feet.
- 6. Signage lighted or non, anticipated location. Signage will be on the building. Any lighting directed on the signage will be toward the building.
- 7. Lights outside for parking lots? Will they be located and managed so they will not become a nuisance to neighbors? The only lighting will be on the building directed downward.
- 8. Are there outside certifications/licenses/regulations required for these sort of facilities? The only license required will be for any sales that will be done.
- 9. What type of additional resources are needed for this sort of proposal (i.e. bulk tanks, etc.)? The only tank would be a LP gas tank. It would be situated close to the building for heat purposes. There will be no bulk tanks. There will be a bulk oil tank inside of the building for oil used in the service work. There will also be a barrel inside for storage of used oil that is picked up by an independent company.
- 10. What sort of nuisances are byproducts of your services odor, fumes, dust, noise and how will you take "preventative action" to mitigate concerns with those? CUP application is for 6 acres with 175'x250' steel building with interior concrete floor. Exterior will be 14' concrete apron with gravel parking surface covering up to 3 acres.

Surface area of parking provides sufficient space for 6-9 employees, and on average 1-2 customers per day. On the west side there will be additional parking spaces available on the apron and on the gravel area.

Gravel surface also provides adequate space for loading or turnarounds.

All parts and equipment will be housed inside the steel building.

As a homeowner and citizen in the Caledonia Township, I have several concerns I would like to address regarding the above noted Conditional Use Permit.

#### **CONCERN 1:**

Traffic – On State Hwy 44, south of Hokah to the City of Caledonia, there is a higher rate of speed, posted speed limit is 60 mph. Most vehicles are driving at a speed of at least 65 mph. Having lived at my residence for 30 years, I have witnessed plenty of big trucks going by at the intersection. There is a straight away right in front of my home. Often, vehicles increase their speed from 65 mpg to pass slower traffic. The purposed salvage yard / dump is right in the zone where divers decide to accelerate and pass slower traffic. During planting and harvest season, drivers are more aware and attentive to farm equipment moving and turning off and onto State Hwy 44. In my mind, when big trucks, semis, semi-trailers slowing, stopping, and turning onto Angus Road from Hwy 44 dramatically changes the safety of this intersection.

#### **CONCERN 2:**

A repair shop for wrecked semi tractors and parts depot, salvage, a semi-tractor, big truck bone yard "a dump", will be located right on Hwy 44. 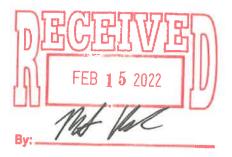

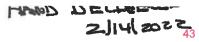

#### **OVERVIEW**

#### REQUEST

The Applicants request to amend the zoning map to change a portion of parcels 03.0128.000 and 03.0128.002 from Agricultural Protection District to Highway Business District.

#### SUMMARY OF NOTEWORTHY TOPICS

The applicants proposed a rezone in order to obtain a conditional use permit to operate an agricultural orientated business in a highway business district

The project will raze all of the existing structures and change the egress from State Road 44 to Angus Drive.

An application for rezoning the parcel to Highway Business district from Agriculture Protection District was submitted on June 18, 2022. Additionally, the applicant has an outstanding application for a conditional use permit in the Agriculture Protection District. Consequently, the conditional use permit is predicated on the corresponding rezoning being approved.

#### TOWNSHIP AND NEIGHBORHOOD COMMENTS

Multiple comments were received and are included in the packet.

In the previous application for a conditional use permit in the Agricultural Protection District the the following comments were received in writing and in person:

- 1. Potential for decreased property values,
- 2. Screening for site activities,
- 3. Storage of parts and/or junk outside,

- 4. Signage,
- 5. Lighting,
- 6. Well & Septic upgrades,
- 7. Roadway surfacing and long-term responsibility,
- 8. Number of employees,
- 9. Surface water management and protection of the Crooked Creek Watershed,
- 10. Seeding open areas and control noxious weeds,
- 11. Business relocation or new venture,
- 12. Ultimately commercial zoning and status of both parcels,
- 13. Highway 44 egress,
- 14. Meeting the definition of agriculture orientated business,
- 15. Potential to become a trucking terminal,
- 16. Traffic management,
- 17. Eyesore and community presence.
- 18. Project support from an adjacent land owner based on the need for farm related repair facilities.

Additional comments were recorded during the February 24 and March 24, 2022 hearings on the conditional use permit application for an agricultural orientated business in an agricultural protection district.

#### SITE CHARACTERISTICS

The site relief will not inhibit the proposed CUP activities. The site soils in the proposed development are characterized as Seaton Silt loam with a capability rating of III e. The existing infrastructure located on the site will be razed. The development will disturb greater than 1 acre of land with an estimated .4 acre of tillable acreage being used. A small portion of the parcel is designated commercial from a 9/11/1969 zoning action.

#### **EVALUATION**

Section 8.6 of the Houston County Zoning Ordinance requires that the Board make findings in support of a decision, but does not prescribe specific criteria. The following findings are proposed by staff for your consideration. Please consider formulating additional findings as you see fit.

- A 1969 rezone changed a 120-foot by 220-foot area from A-1 Agricultural Protection to B-1
  Highway Service Business. This is essentially an expansion of an existing Highway Business
  District.
- 2. The property at 11489 State 44 is zoned Highway Business District. This is just over a half mile further from the City of Caledonia than the parcel considering rezoning.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Should the permit be granted, staff recommend requiring the following conditions:

- 1. The Permittee shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations;
- 2. The County may enter onto the premises at reasonable times and in a reasonable manner to ensure the permit holder is in compliance with the conditions and all other applicable statutes, rues, and ordinances.
- 3. A final survey shall be prepared showing boundaries substantially similar to those presented in the application.

Caledonia, Minnesota September 11, 1969

The Houston County Planning Commission met on Thursday, September 11, 1969 at 1:30 o'clock P.M. at the Courthouse, Village of Caledonia, Minnesota for the purpose of conducting Public Hearings scheduled for that time.

The following members were present: Harlie Larson, Chairman; Virgil Johnson, H. M. McLaird, Chester Lachecki, Elling Solum, Zoning Administrator Don Carlson, County Attorney William Von Arx, and Commissioners Harold Leary, M. R. Summers, and Albert Deters.

The meeting was called to order by Harlie Larson, Chairman.

Hearing No. 12:

Notice of Hearing on the application of Bob E. Robson for an amendment to the Houston County Zoning Ordinance involving a change in Zoning District from A-1 Agricultural to B-1 Highway Service Business District was read. The application covered a parcel of land in the NE corner of the NE\*, Section 12-102-6, approximately 120 feet North and South by 220 feet East and West on which he proposed to build a Television Repair & Sales Store, Bob E. Robson appeared to answer questions regarding the proposed building, size, construction, on-site parking, and other facilities. There being no opposition, motion was made by Virgil Johnson, seconded by Elling Solum, and duly carried to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners that this area be rezoned and that a Building Permit be issued for the building.

An application was received from Joe Corey for a variance of set-back requirements on a parcel of land in the Village of Clinton, Town of Money Creek, and for a Building Permit for a trailer, breezeway, and garage thereon. It was explained that the present set-back requirement on CSAH #26 would place his buildings so far out of line with existing buildings in the Town. After checking with the County Engineer, motion was made by H. M. McLaird, seconded by Virgil Johnson, and duly approved to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners

The area proposed to be rezoned is located in parcels 03.0128.000 and 03.0128.002 consisting of approximately 6 acres shown on attached *Exhibit A*. A completed survey will be filed with the Houston County Planning and Zoning Office prior to final approval and granting of the request for rezoning. A portion of parcel 03.0128.000 is presently zoned highway business district.

3. The present district classification of the area in the proposed district classification.

The property is presently classified as agricultural and highway business district. The proposed district classification of the property is highway business district. The property abuts Highway 44 and Angus Drive. A portion of the property had a commercial use and zoned highway business district.

4. Proposed use of the land.

A building would be constructed on the property to be used for the maintenance and repair of semi-tractors, vehicles, trucks and equipment used primarily in agricultural. All work would be performed inside the building. Petitioners own all land surrounding the land to be rezoned except for abutting Angus Drive and Highway 44. Access would be provided by Angus Drive.

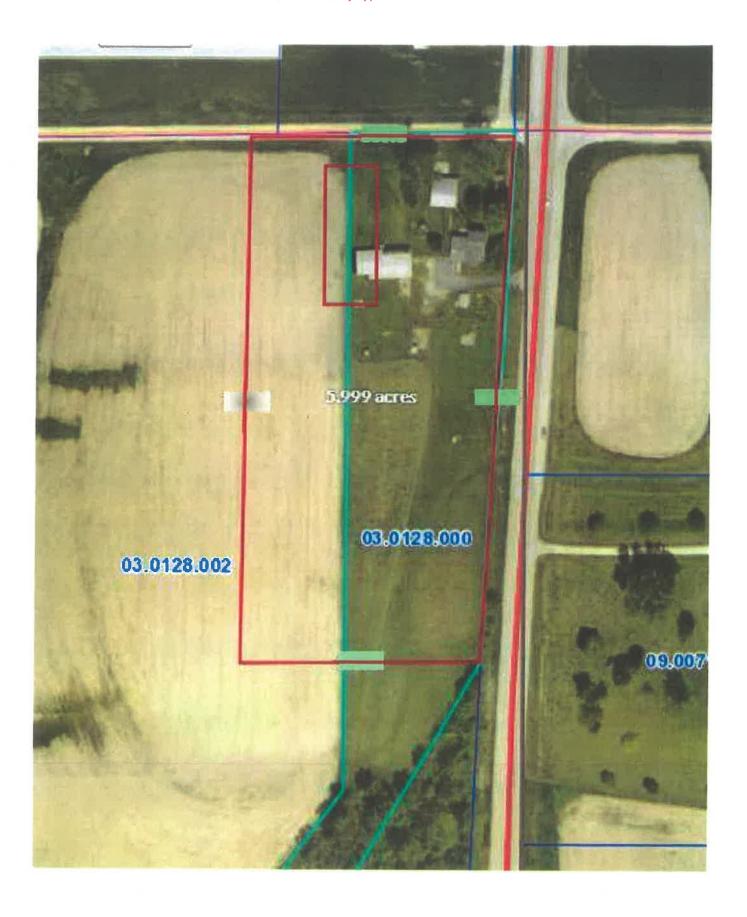
5. Compatibility with the land-use plan of Houston County. Statement of conditions warranting the change in zoning district or uses.

Property is located approximately one mile from the City of Caledonia on Highway 44. The Houston County Comprehensive Plan encourages urban growth outside of a city to be within a close proximity to a city. Within approximately one-half of a mile on Highway 44 from the property to be rezoned, there is a property zoned highway business district. The predecessor in title used a portion of the property for a commercial business and that is the reason it is zoned highway business district.

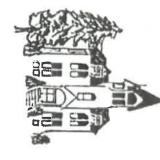

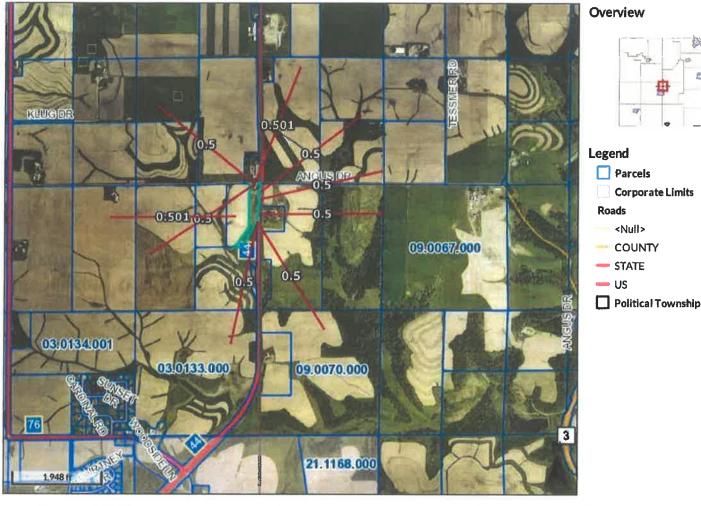

One of Caledonia's attractions is the beautiful rolling farmland along the approach to Caledonia along 44. Although there is a grandfathered business on this route, Zenke's Auction property, due to the nature of that business, the items to be auctioned off are constantly changing, and are removed from the site when auctioned. Changing rolling hills farmland to a salvage yard of old trucks on the approach to our community I do not think would be a valuable addition to our community, and it would best be left where it currently is, or on land already appropriately zoned in the midst of other commercial entities and not in an area where people live and farm. Comments in regard to the Joe Rud and Craig Helke conditional use request.

- 1)Ail adjoining farms and homes are permitted uses. Three homes surrounding the proposed application acres will feel detrimental impacts and will be injurious to our enjoyment of our homes and properties.
- 2)The predominate use of the surrounding area is AG and residential. This permit would change the landscape causing a negative impact on surrounding area and residences.
- 3)Increased heavy traffic both with and without road restrictions.
- 4)Public funding is spent to enhance county tourism. We feel the location of this proposed commercial business will detract from the overall scenic beauty of our rustic bluff country.
- 5)From the north turning west onto Angus drive, the turn lane is too narrow to make a safe turn. Both north and south turn lanes are turn lane only and are not for bypass lanes.
- 6)We feel the proposed use will cause excessive dust, noise, light pollution and will be a disturbance to our quality of life.
- 7)This commercial development will be more intense than any of the current development of the surrounding area and will dramatically change the characteristics and beauty of the surrounding area.
- 8)The commercial development does not meet the intent of the Houston County land use plan. All surrounding properties currently fit into the agricultural district of the land use plan. This commercial development does not belong in the agricultural district. It will conflict with the surrounding permitted uses.
- 9)It is our opinion that the current businesses of H&R Enterprises and Joe Rud trucking are commercial businesses located in the Caledonia industrial park. This permit would allow them to move and expand their current commercial businesses. We believe this would be a commercial expansion into an agricultural district. Which will conflict with current land permitted uses.
- 10) Subdivision 3. level II Home occupation. Houston county zoning ordinance for a Conditional use permit requires the land owner to live on property. The only way the ordinance allows for a conditional use permit in the agricultural zone is for the occupant to have a business contained in the dwelling or accessory building with a maximum of 5000 square feet. Junk yard and scrap yards are prohibited
- 11)It is our opinion the permit application lacks the necessary information throughout the application to make any sound decisions that would protect and preserve the environment, aesthetics, enjoyment and natural beauty of the area.

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We are still very opposed to this for many reason. We have additional concerns as we see how they race four wheeler s down the gravel roads. This is very unsafe and very unsettling to the neighbors. This shows their disregard for neighbors and how they will be handling their business going forward? This is in contrast to what they have said they would do and how they said they would conduct their business. If we look at actions and not words it is evident they do not want to be good custodians of the area. We have only one opportunity to be good custodians of this unique and beautiful area that we have made our home.

- 1) When I purchased my property at 11807 State Highway 44 I was told by Houston County Zoning that no business other then a home based business could operate in an agricultural zone. Being assured the area would stay as it was, I then changed my plans of moving my business to 11807 State Highway 44 to building my home there.
- 2) In a conversation I have had with Craig Helke prior to the purchase of their property in Caledonia Township he told me they were looking for a place to have a truck salvage yard. They would also have to have the body shop on the highway to get insurance company referrals. To do this they were looking to find a place in the country and to get zoning changed they would "just say they are working on farm trucks" to qualify as agricultural. I have received a text from someone unknown to me. They questioned why there is nothing on their current web about farm equipment repair. I will be glade to share the text message.
- 3) This will make more traffic on an already very busy highway and put heavy semi type trucks year round on a gravel road.
- 4) The area we live in has great natural resources. Clean air, water and great beauty. Having a business with trucks and equipment along the highway for sale and repair will detract from the area and bring potential hazards to our highways. Changing the lives of all the surrounding residents.
- 5) I have talked to many of my neighbors and there are concerns about theft problems. From what we I have been told H&R has had parts stolen off their salvage trucks. My home has been burglarized. We are afraid this may get worse as it becomes a new draw for theft.
- 6) One of our neighbors has concern of rodents in the equipment sitting out. Another has concerns about weeds and the overall blemish of the area.
- 7) Reduced land and home values for current residents.

### RESOLUTION NO. 22-39

#### **AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES PREVENTION AID**

August 9, 2022

WHEREAS, 2014 Session Law Chapter 308 enacted by the Legislature provides Minnesota counties a County Program Aid grant for Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) prevention. The amount designated for each county is based on the number of watercraft trailer launches as well as the number of watercraft trailer parking spaces within each county. Houston County was allocated \$22,612 for 2023 and years following (5 watercraft trailer launches and 50 watercraft trailer parking spaces), and

WHEREAS, the legislation requires that Houston County must establish, by resolution or through adoption of a plan, guidelines for the use of the proceeds which are to prevent the introduction or limit the spread of aquatic invasive species at all access sites within the county, and

WHEREAS, the county may appropriate the proceeds directly or may use any portion of the proceeds to provide funding to a soil and water conservation district in the county, for a joint powers board or cooperative agreement with another political subdivision, a watershed district in the county, or a lake association located in the county. Any money appropriated by the county to a different entity or political subdivision must be used as required under this section, and

WHEREAS, the county must submit a copy of its guidelines for use of the proceeds to the Department of Natural Resources by December 31 of the year the payments are received, and

WHEREAS, maintaining an ongoing effort to inform the public of resource needs, resource impairments and resource protection matters has been identified as the most important tool in addressing water resource concerns in the Houston County Water Plan, the fight against Aquatic Invasive Species is included in this educational effort and will continue to be a cornerstone of Houston County's Water Plan.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Houston County, Minnesota designate oversight of Houston County's AIS prevention efforts to the Root River Soil and Water Conservation District and delegates to them the responsibility to prepare, implement and report annually a plan to allocate the funding in accordance with the above legislation.

**Background:** On August 3, 2022 Amanda (Mandi) Lenser co-owner of The Butcher Shoppe that she owns with her husband Justin Lenser requested from the EDA financing to purchase equipment and inventory for a meat and deli business that would be located in Hokah, MN. The total project cost for the project is around \$101,000 with the owners injecting \$21,000 in equity.

The project will create one full time job, with the prospect of growing and hiring additional part time staff in the future.

**Recommendation:** After due consideration and discussion, the EDA Board of Directors unanimously passed a motion on August 3, 2022 to recommend that the Houston County Commissioners approve the request for assistance by providing a \$15,000 loan at the 2022 set rate and terms (2.25% for 10 years). The motion was approved with one condition: that the owners provide a list of equipment with vin numbers so the County could do a UCC filing on the equipment. The EDA Board also invited The Butcher Shoppe to come back after one year and make another request if additional funding was needed at that time, and the business was going well.

Action Required: A motion made by the Board of Commissioners approving request for assistance by providing a \$15,000 loan to The Butcher Shoppe LLC at the 2022 set rate and terms (2.25% for 10 years) from the County's Revolving Loan Fund.
